Wilfred Moseley to Mr. Hodgson, 18 January 1934

Written in a different hand in pencil in top left corner of page: "Refer to Dr. Finney for answer"

Letter is hand-written in pencil, and addresses the University Treasurer, Telfair Hodgson.

"Mr. Hodgson

I am writing you in regard to the note, which my Father says the interest will be due on Jan 24. My Father is not making any money, only what we give him. We hope to pay the principal of that note just as soon as possible. The interest, my sister wrote . . . would be \$15, but we will not get paid here until 31 of Jan., as Gov pays once a month. Will it be all right if the money is there by Feb 2[?]. Please wire me if it wil be OK, for Papa is worrying because he will not have it on 24[th]. I told him I was shure [sic] you would wait until then, knowing his circumstances, [and] as all Gov employees were cut 15 per cent.

Wire my brother collect on this end. In your telegram just state if money is there by second of Feb OK.
